A message to prospective students of Kyoto-McGill International Collaborative Program in Genomic Medicine (Doctoral Program)

In April 2018, Kyoto University and McGill University jointly established the Kyoto-McGill International Collaborative Program in Genomic Medicine.

A single academic degree jointly conferred on students who have completed this program. Students will spend a minimum of one year of the program period at the partner university and, in addition to completing the curriculum coursework, will conduct their research under the supervision of their academic advisors.

The establishment of the Joint Doctoral Degree Program, herewith named the Kyoto-McGill International Collaborative Program in Genomic Medicine, aims to promote complementary educational and research programs that exploit the unique features and expertise of each university, and to thereby provide the highest possible level of education that could not be achieved by one university alone. Under the program, talented individuals will be trained who will master various analytical techniques and skills that make use of biological big data, and who will contribute to the future development of preventive medicine and to the welfare of all peoples.

I Major and Enrollment Capacity

Kyoto-McGill International Collaborative School of Genomic Medicine: 4

II Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must satisfy one of the following requirements below (or who will satisfy one of the following requirements by March 31, 2026).

1. Those who have graduated from a six-year program of Japanese university (limited to programs in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, and pharmacy).
2. Those who have completed 18 years of formal school education outside of Japan. (see item III)
3. Those who have completed 18 years of formal school education provided by a foreign institute by taking distance/online programs while residing in Japan. (see item III)
4. Those who have completed a undergraduate programs provided by a foreign institutes which is designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in Japan(hereafter “the MEXT”) (limited to programs which is equivalent to the 18 years of formal school education in Japan). (see item III)
5. Those who have been awarded a degree equivalent to bachelor’s degree by completing a 5 years or longer program at a foreign university/other foreign educational institution which have been accredited by the respective foreign government or a person who has obtained certification by the appropriate foreign governmental agency, or which has been designated by the MEXT as the equivalent thereof. (This includes those who have completed the distance/online program offered by the appropriate school by taking courses while residing in Japan as well as one of those foreign educational programs at an appropriate educational institution positioned in the school education system of the said country and designated by said authorization described in the preceding Item) (see item III)
6. Those who have been designated by the MEXT (Notification No. 39, Ministry of Education, 1955).
 - 1) Those who have completed an undergraduate program in either medicine or dentistry at a university in accordance with the former University Decree (1918, Imperial Edict No. 388).
 - 2) Those who have graduated from National Defense College in accordance with the Ministry of Defense Establishment Law (1954, Law No. 164).
 - 3) Those who have completed a master's program or a professional graduate school program which stated in accordance with the School Education Act (1947, Law No. 26) Article 99, Item 2 / Those qualified to receive a

master's degree, or those who have been enrolled for two years or more in a consistent five-year doctoral program which is not divided into two-year master's program and three-year doctoral program, have obtained more than 30 credits there and completed required research work (including persons who fall to Degree Regulations (1953, Ministry of Education Directive No. 9) Article 6, No. 1, prior to the revisions of the Degree Regulations by order of Ministry Directive (1974, Ministry of Education Directive No. 29) and who are recognized by the Graduate School of Medicine, Kyoto University as having demonstrated academic excellence which is equivalent or superior to that of those who have graduated from a veterinary medicine program at a graduate school or non-degree program, or who have graduated from a program at a graduate school or non-degree program in medicine, dentistry or pharmacy founded in order to cultivate practical clinical ability.

7. Those who have been enrolled for four years or longer in a six-year program (limited to programs in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine and pharmacy) of a university in Japan (including those the MEXT approved as having equivalent education, in accordance with Article 102-2 of the School Education Law), and who are recognized by the Graduate School of Medicine, Kyoto University as completed required academic credits with an academic excellence. (requires Eligibility Screening; see item IV)
8. Those who demonstrated academic performance equivalent or superior to Eligibility Requirement “II-1.” on the individual eligibility screening given by the Graduate School of Medicine, Kyoto University and who will be at least 24 years of the age by March 31, 2026 (JST). (requires Eligibility Screening; see item IV)

Note: Some Research Fields require students to have clinical experience as a medical doctor; please refer to Supplemental Guideline (in Japanese text only) on our website and contact and confirm to the Research Field which you are interested in.

III Preliminary Eligibility Check (for those who have graduated from foreign university)

Graduates of foreign universities who wish to have their eligibility for application verified after application for AAO must apply for a Preliminary Eligibility Check via email to the Office of Student Affairs at the Graduate School of Medicine by **5:00 pm on Thursday, July 31, 2025**.

IV Eligibility Screening (Applicants falling under “II Eligibility Requirements” 7 and 8)

1. Application deadline for eligibility screening

Applicants falling under Eligibility Requirements 7 or 8 are required to submit the following documents for Eligibility Screening to the Office of Student Affairs by **5:00 pm on Thursday, August 7, 2025**.

When mailing the documents, please write “Application for Eligibility Screening to the Doctoral Program in Genomic Medicine for 2026” in red on the front of the envelope, and all documents must be sent by registered express mail. The documents must arrive by the deadline. Documents postmarked on or before Monday, August 4, 2025 (if mailed from within Japan), and that were sent by registered express mail will be accepted even if they arrive after the deadline.

Overseas applicants must send the documents by international delivery service like EMS with tracking number and documents must arrive by the deadline.

- 1) Eligibility Requirement 7: Those who have been enrolled for four years or longer in a six-year program (limited to programs in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine and pharmacy) of a university in Japan (including those the MEXT approved as having equivalent education, in accordance with Article 102-2 of the School Education Law), and who are recognized by the Graduate School of Medicine, Kyoto University as completed the required academic credits with an academic excellence.

- 2) Eligibility Requirement 8: Those who demonstrated academic performance equivalent or superior to Eligibility Requirements 1 on the individual eligibility screening given by the Graduate School of Medicine, Kyoto University and who will be at least 24 years of the age by March 31, 2026.

*	Letter of Recommendation	To be prepared by a research advisor, etc., at the last school in which you are/were enrolled. Must be kept sealed and confidential.

	Research Activity History	Please describe your research activities following graduation from undergraduate program. (Including a CV, list of publication, abstract of the published article, research achievements, etc) Please attach the copies of research articles and presentation abstracts.

3. Eligibility Screening Decisions

Eligibility Screening decisions will be notified to applicants by email by the start of application period.

V Application Procedures

Applicants must complete the 3 steps; “Online Application”, “Online Payment of the Examination Fee” and “Submission of the Application Documents”.

Upload a photo file in the Personal Information section when registering online.

Applicants must prepare a photo file (JPEG/JPG) of a single person taken within the last three months with no background and no hat or head covering unless there is a religious or medical reason.

Pixel size: 480-6000 pixels wide, 480-6000 pixels high

Images that have been manipulated with image editing software or photos that are ineligible, such as those in which

the person is difficult to identify or the face is unevenly positioned, will not be accepted.

International applicants who have not yet arrived in Japan must also upload a copy of their passport (the page with the face photo) (JPEG/JPG, PNG, GIF, PDF).

All the application documents must be enclosed to an envelope ("square No.2 size envelope (240mm x332mm) "or a similar size) as the submission envelope with the print out of the Address Sheet for Sending Application Documents (only if mailed from within Japan) from the website pasted on.

Overseas applicants can send the submission envelope and put it into another envelope and send it to be delivered by the deadline below. Using EMS or another international courier service with mail tracking is recommended.

1. Application Period

Tuesday, September 2 to Monday, September 8, 5:00pm, 2025 (JST).

(Application documents must arrive during the above period strictly, by post or in person)

Office hours: 9:00 am-12:00 pm, 1:00 pm-5:00 pm.

If you are sending the package of documents by postal mail, it must arrive by 5:00 pm on September 8, 2025 (JST). However, the package postmarked on or before September 2, 2025 and that was sent by registered express mail from within Japan will also be accepted even if it arrives after the deadline.

8	Copy of Residence Card	Only foreign applicants who have residence card have to submit a two-sided copy of a residence card.
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- Notes:
- 1) The content of submitted application documents cannot be changed in principle.
 - 2) An examination voucher must be printed from the online application system from Tuesday, October 14, 1:00pm to the examination date. Bring it on the day of the examination. Also, print and confirm the examination instructions from the online application system at the same time. The examination venue will be notified then.
 - 3) For applicants who will be selected the Japanese Government (MEXT) scholarship or be awarded its extension scholarship in April 2026, the application fee will be reimbursed. The details will be announced at the enrollment procedures. Note that the scholarship is not paid during the stay in McGill. Also, the scholarship students are not allowed to stay at McGill over two years.
 - 4) Submitted application documents will not be returned.

VI Evaluations

Applicants are evaluated comprehensively by performance on the entrance examinations, academic transcripts, English proficiency test score, and Statement of Purpose.

- For the General medicine / General biology, the applicant will select two questions from a total of 11 questions: basic (4), clinical (medical: 2, surgical: 2), and social medicine (3).
- Applicants must arrive at the examination room by 9:30 am.

2. Second-Round Screening

Kyoto University and McGill University will make an overall assessment of the results of the first-round screening and thereby determine the successful final applicants. As all courses in this school will be conducted in English, students whose native language is not English will be required to have 86 points or higher on the TOEFL internet-based test (no less than 20 in each of the four sections; Reading, Listening, Speaking, and Writing).

VII Admission Decisions

1. First-Round Screening

At 11:00 am on Friday, November 28, 2025, the list of examination numbers of successful applicants is to be posted on the website of the Graduate School of Medicine.

2. Second-Round Screening

Examination result is to be sent by email early February, 2026.

Applicants must keep their examination voucher until the enrollment procedures are completed.

VIII Enrollment Procedures

1. Admission fee : 282,000 yen (subject to change)
2. Tuition First semester : 267,900 yen (total annual tuition: 535,800 yen) (subject to change)

*The amounts indicated above are tentative and subject to change.

*If the above amounts are revised at or after your enrollment, the new amounts will be applied at the time of payment.

*McGill University also will charge students, who initiated their enrollment procedures at Kyoto University, the McGill University tuition fees during their study period in McGill University. However, McGill University will, at the same time, provide these students with a scholarship that will fully cover the costs of the McGill University tuition fees.
